The International Ombudsman Institute (IOI) convened at The Hague, Netherlands for the 13<sup>th</sup> IOI World Conference on the 13 – 17 of May. The delegation from the Office of the Ombudsman Tonga included Mrs. 'Alisi Numia Taumoepeau, KC (Ombudsman) and Mr. Roman Vaihu (Director of Investigation).

King Willem-Alexander of the Netherlands opened the conference with a speech welcoming delegates from around the world to the 'international city of peace and justice'. His Majesty emphasized the vital role Ombudsmen play in advocating for citizens who encounter problems due to actions of government. He highlighted the importance of transparency, independence and good governance.

The IOI held breakout sessions featuring a wide range of mandates that different Ombuds Offices focused on. The sessions allowed for a rich outcome of experiences from all over the world. The conference centred on the overall theme of "Act Together for Our Tomorrow".

## **Oceania Perspectives on Human Dignity**

The Oceanian Perspective on Human Dignity Conference was held on the 23 – 25 April at Brigham Young University in La'ie Hawaii. The Conference created an opportunity for leaders, experts and scholars to expand on perspectives of human dignity. Delegates from Tonga included Mrs. Linda Folaumoetu'i (Attorney General), Mrs. 'Alisi Taumoepeau (Ombudsman) and Dr. Mele Tupou-Vaitohi (Senior Law Lecturer at Victoria University, New Zealand).

The Ombudsman shared insight into what human dignity looks like in the form of a 5-year-old school girl, Melaia Tuaimei'api of Tungua, Ha'apai. Melaia is selected as 'Office of the Ombudsman Resilience Star'. In the aftermath of the Hunga-Tonga Hunga-Ha'apai volcanic eruption and tsunami, she was captured in a photo to be carrying a bundle of papers and said to be looking for her school backpack. In the face of adversity, this 5-year-old girl saying "Yes this is my reality, but I have my future to focus on" portrays a strong sense of what human dignity looks like for a Tongan.
